## WHAT ARE WE VOTING FOR?

The purpose of a general election is to have run-offs for any races in the preceding primary election in which no candidate received more than 50% of the total votes. For this election's statewide races, there are run-offs for Secretary of State, Attorney General, and Treasurer.

There will also be run-offs for: legislature seats in some districts, Districts 4 and 7 of the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE), and various local government offices throughout the state.

All voters across the state will be able to vote on four proposed amendments to the State Constitution. Some voters may also have local propositions on their ballots.

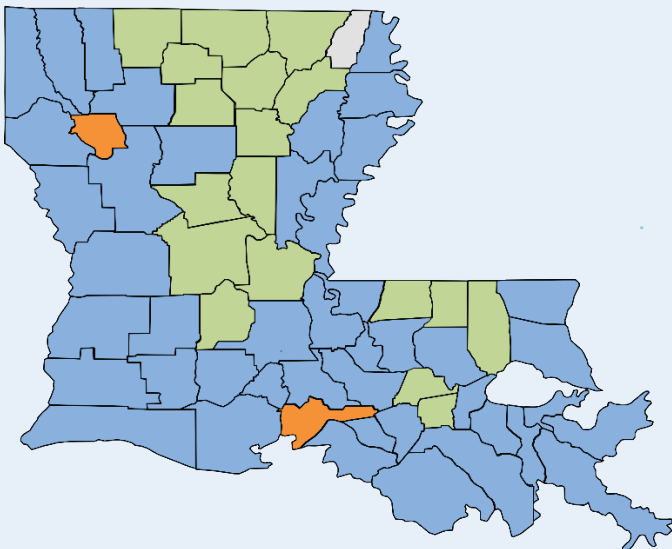

### LOUISIANA AT A GLANCE

In addition to statewide offices and Constitutional Amendments in all parishes:

- **43 parishes will have legislature and/or BESE races, as well as local elections:** Acadia, Allen, Assumption, Beauregard, Bienville, Bossier, Caddo, Calcasieu, Cameron, Catahoula, Concordia, DeSoto, East Baton Rouge, East Carroll, Franklin, Iberville, Jefferson, Jefferson Davis, Lafayette, Lafourche, Livingston, Madison, Natchitoches, Orleans, Plaquemines, Pointe Coupee, Sabine, St. Bernard, St. Charles, St. John, St. Landry, St. Martin, St. Mary, St. Tammany, Tensas, Terrebonne, Vermilion, Vernon, Washington, Webster, West Baton Rouge, West Feliciana, and Winn.
- **18 parishes will have local elections but no legislature or BESE races:** Ascension, Avoyelles, Caldwell, Claiborne, East Feliciana, Evangeline, Grant, Jackson, LaSalle, Lincoln, Morehouse, Ouachita, Rapides, Richland, St. Helena, St. James, Tangipahoa, and Union.
- **2 parishes will have legislature and/or BESE races but no local elections:** Iberia and Red River.
- **1 parish will only have the statewide offices and Constitutional Amendments:** West Carroll.
